## **1.0. INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 Activities relating to the 2025-2027 Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) and the 2025 Budget commenced fully following the approval of the 2025-2027 Medium Term Fiscal Framework (MTFF) and Medium-Term Budget Framework (MTBF) by the Ogun State House of Assembly in September 2024.
- 1.2 The MTFF and MTBF represent the top-down phases of the MTEF while the Medium-Term Sector Strategy (MTSS) phase requires a bottom-up approach, involving inputs and contributions from citizens to promote inclusivity and fiscal responsibility.
- 1.3 Citizen inputs are gathered through consultations with Local Government Areas and Town Hall Meetings held across the four divisions of Ogun State.
- 1.4 As stipulated in Part III, Section 19 of the Ogun State Fiscal Responsibility Law, 2020 (as amended), the first year of the three-year MTEF serves as the Annual Budget hence the Ministry of Budget and Planning, led by the Honourable Commissioner for Budget and Planning, initiated Town Hall Meetings to gather stakeholder inputs for the 2025-2027 MTEF and 2025 Budget. The meetings were scheduled in the following divisions:
  - Ijebu: 23rd October 2024
  - Remo: 24th October 2024
  - Yewa: 29th October 2024
  - Egba: 31st October 2024
- 1.5 The Honourable Commissioner for Finance and Chief Economic Adviser (CEA) Mr. Dapo Okubadejo represented His Excellency, the Governor, Prince (Dr.) Dapo Abiodun, CON, who was unavoidably absent due to other equally important State's assignments .

1.6 Mr. Adewole Dosunmu of the Ministry of Information and Strategy served as the Master of Ceremony.

## **2.0 ATTENDANCE AT THE MEETING**

2.1 The meeting recorded a total of 771 participants, including key dignitaries, officials, and representatives from various sectors of society. Notable attendees included:

### **3.0 OPENING**

3.1 The meeting commenced with the rendition of the State Anthem at 12.45pm. The Chief Imam, Ijebu-Mushin, Alhaji Sarafadeen Adeniji and the Bishop-elect, Dr. Wasiu Olalekan said the Opening Prayer.

### **4.0. GOVERNOR'S ADDRESS**

4.1 The Hon. Commissioner for Finance and Chief Economic Adviser (CEA) extended Mr. Governor's apology for his unavoidable absence and happily welcomed the distinguished stakeholders.

4.2 The Governor, in his address, noted that the goal of the engagement was to ensure that the budget reflects the people's needs and promotes fiscal discipline. He further appreciated the roles of the citizens' participation and stakeholders' inputs in over five years of his Administration and collective governance, assuring that the inputs would be considered in the 2025 - 2027 Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) and the 2025 annual Budget in the same manner the year 2024 budget contained the Ninety percent of the year 2023 Townhall Meeting Citizens' contributions.

4.3 Highlighting the Administration's accomplishments, the Governor noted that over 600 kilometers of roads had been constructed/rehabilitated statewide with 243.3 kilometers in Ogun East Senatorial District alone.

4.4 His Excellency added that 64.01 kilometers of rural roads were under construction in selected Local Government Areas to boost the rural area accessibility and agricultural productivity.

4.5 Generally, the Governor alluded that his Administration's infrastructure investment has immense transformational and multiplier effects on job creation for citizens and revenue generation for the State, noting the ongoing construction of the Airport

City around the state-of-the-art Gateway Agro-Cargo International Airport and the recently launched Africa Continental Free Trade Area (ACFTA).

- 4.6 In respect of social welfare and wellbeing which encompasses health, housing, environment, security, water supply and women empowerment, the Governor expressed delight that key indicators showed strong improvement in the citizens and residents' welfare and wellbeing. He attributed this improvement to the impacts of the upgraded and equipped Primary Healthcare Centres (PHCs) of his Administration across the State: "Ilera-Dero" Health Insurance Scheme, and "Ibi-Dero" Programme for all pregnant women irrespective of class or status. His Excellency added that with the official launching of the Health Insurance Scheme to the State's formal sector, the Public Servants, "the engine room" of government, had been brought into the scheme so as to receive adequate healthcare.
- 4.7 Towards enhancing the well-being of the citizens, the present administration announced the payment of a new minimum wage to all workers in the State effective October 2024. This significant increase would not only improve the livelihoods of our workers, it would also serve as a catalyst for economic growth and development.
- 4.8 In sustaining the State's legacy as the education capital of Nigeria, he disclosed that his Administration has been showing unwavering commitment and investment in the education sector. The Ogun-Teach Intervention Programme has been successful with all the four thousand (4,000) interns gainfully employed into the Ogun State Teaching Service Commission and the State Universal Basic Education Board. The State's Job Portal has also been opened for the recruitment of another set of 1,000 interns to fill the vacancies in Primary, Secondary and Technical Colleges.
- 4.9 Showcasing the Administration's commitment to youth empowerment, the Governor stated that the Ogun State Sports Festival was held to discover new talents and prepare them for national and international competitions, adding that the forthcoming National Sports Festival (Gateway 2024) in Ogun State would be another avenue to showcase these talents and discover new ones.

- 4.10 Noting that agriculture has much employment, income generation and food security potentials, the Governor stated that on Monday, 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2024, his Administration distributed fertilizers to different categories of farmers including youths, to ensure farmers had needed resources to cultivate their lands effectively and efficiently, boost crop yields and ultimately secure food supply for our dear State and the Nation at large.
- 4.11 His Excellency revealed further that Ogun State has joined the league of rice producing States in the Country with the flag-off harvest of 200 hectares of Rice at the Magboro Rice farm in Obafemi-Owode Local Government on Wednesday, 21<sup>st</sup>, August 2024. He also noted the groundbreaking ceremony for production of raw materials feedstock at the Nigeria Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zone (SAPZ) located within the Remo Economic Industrial Cluster.
- 4.12 In ensuring the security of lives and property, the Governor noted that his Administration procured over 100 patrol vans, motorcycles and other security equipment in the first instance, and later in collaboration with Lagos and Oyo States, procured surveillance drones to monitor activities along the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway.
- 4.13 In recognition of the pivotal role of the energy sector, we launched the first phase of the State's e-mobility initiative by converting seventeen (17) diesel-powered Ashok Leyland and two (2) Hyundai Mass Transit Buses into CNG-powered vehicles. Fourteen (14) of these CNG Buses are currently being used in the Mowe/Ibafo-Berger Mass Transit operation. The remaining Three (3) are on the Ita-Oshin-Adatan corridor within the Abeokuta Metropolis. The second phase consisting of 150 electric bikes were launched on Wednesday, 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2024. This would complement the unlimited daily demand for energy and fossil fuels as well as reduce our carbon emission and bring about a significant change on our perception about mobility in our daily lives.
- 4.14 This Administration has also provided transformers to more than 300 communities across the 20 Local Government Areas in the State to boost electricity supply,

whilst deploying other renewable power sources through the installation of solar power points as well as creating an enabling environment for the development of a gas distribution infrastructure for power supply.

- 4.15 Noting that his Administration had made significant progress, the Governor stated there remained much more to achieve hence would stay focused and steadfast, using the remaining three years of their tenure to strengthen the hope of the people and building on the foundation already established.
- 4.16 Conclusively, the Governor said his Administration would continue to encourage constructive criticism and continue the good work of our collective dreams for Ogun State.
- 4.17 Finally, he thanked all the Royal Fathers and other dignitaries for their participation and called on the Honourable Commissioner for Budget and Planning for the Context Setting.

## **5.0 CONTEXT SETTING**

- 5.1 The Honourable Commissioner for Budget and Planning outlined the objectives of the meeting to include soliciting citizens' inputs for incorporation into the 2025-2027 Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) and the 2025 Budget, in accordance with the provisions of Part III, Section 19 of the Ogun State Fiscal Responsibility Law, 2020 (as amended) as well as providing status update on the implementation of the 2024 Budget.
- 5.2 He reiterated the Administration's commitment to good governance, feedback mechanism and citizens participation, and highlighted the mission statements which among others are: accountable leadership, enhanced human capital development, value chain, ease of doing business (EoDB), productivity/connectivity, healthcare facilities, equity/fairness and peaceful co-existence.
- 5.3 Noting that His Excellency's vision was to create a focused and qualitative governance, he asserted the Strategic Thrust of ISEYA Pillars and the statewide distribution of resources across the four divisions with focus on strategic allocation of resources to complete ongoing projects, projects with revenue potential, projects

consistent with priorities articulated in the State Economic Development Strategy and projects that would enhance employment generation.

5.4 Giving the pictorial evidence of ISEYA achievements in the division, the Commissioner noted that Infrastructure and Social Welfare and Wellbeing recorded 25% each, while Education and Youth Empowerment/Agriculture & Food Security recorded 32% and 18% respectively. Further statistics on projects implemented in the division over the last 12 months across the Local Government Areas are:

- Ijebu-Ode (19 projects)
- Ijebu East (9 projects)
- Ijebu North (13 projects)
- Ijebu North East (8 projects)
- Ogun Waterside (9 projects)
- Odogbolu (7 projects)

5.5 Rounding off the presentation, the Commissioner noted that 90 percent (i.e. 340) of the inputs collected during the 2023 Town Hall Meeting made the Year 2024 Budget, adding that the remaining 10 percent (i.e. 37) would be considered in the new medium term of 2025-2027.

5.6 Finally, the Commissioner encouraged the stakeholders present and the online participants to feel free in making their development needs known for consideration in the preparation of the 2025 – 2027 Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) and Year 2025 Budget. The virtual participants were advised to use the attached link <https://bit.ly/OGSG2025budget> for their inputs.

## **6.0 INTERACTIVE SESSION**

6.1 **The Gbegande of Ososa, Oba Adetoye Alatise**, commended His Excellency for his infrastructural development strides, using the Awokoya road in Ijebu-Ode as a point of reference. He however drew attention to the need to construct rural roads especially the Ososa road which connects the community to the Lagos-Sagamu-Ijebu-Ode expressway.

- 6.2 **The Ebumawe of Ago-Iwoye, Oba Abdul Rasaq Adenugba**, praised the Governor for the laudable road projects in the division particularly in Ago-Iwoye, Idowa, Ijebu Imushin, Oko, Oloni, and so on. He noted that Mr. Governor had executed all the projects he promised them in Ago-Iwoye. However, he appealed to His Excellency on behalf of communities like Ajakaye and part of the Ogun Waterside area for the construction of roads connecting the communities to improve their standard of living.
- 6.3 **Orimolusi of Ijebu-Igbo, Oba Lawrence Adebajo**, applauded the Governor for his Administration developmental projects across the sectors of education, health and transportation. He however emphasized the need to construct roads in Ogidi, Odenselu, Itamarun, Imomo, Odesemadegun, and Atan in Ijebu North East to boost the agricultural activities and condition of living in the areas. He also requested for the extension of Ilishan - Ago-Iwoye road to Oru and Ijebu Igbo. He drew attention to Idomila road behind Ijebu-Ode Stadium which had seriously deteriorated, while asking for palliative intervention on the Sagamu-Lagos Expressway though it is a federal road. Speaking on Agriculture, Oba Adebajo flagged the loss of revenue by the State Government in Apoje Farm Settlement, stating that cocoa harvested from the settlement are transported through Osun State by some unscrupulous people/farmers, requesting the State Government to put in place necessary surveillance to curb the ugly trend.
- 6.4 **The Chairman of the Governor's Advisory Council (GAC), Chief Olu Okuboyejo** commended the Governor for his outstanding performance in infrastructure. Adding to the inputs by the Royal Fathers, he emphasized the need for road maintenance vote in the 2025 Budget to elongate the life span of the monumental projects executed by this Administration.
- 6.5 **His Excellency, Former Deputy Governor, Senator Shefiu Adegbenga Kaka** commended the Governor for his inclusive governance and for being a listening Governor. He reminded His Excellency of the promise to build a Cafeteria/Dinning Hall for Ijebu Muslims College, Ijebu-Ode during the School's 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and called attention to the need to reconstruct: Oke-Agbo road leading to the Orimolusi of Ijebu-Igbo Palace and the Mini Campus Ago-Iwoye road leading to Aletheia

University Ago-Iwoye. Adding to the foregoing, he appealed for a new 500KVA Transformer for his community which has been total black-out due to the breakdown of the existing transformer since January, 2024. Finally, he advocated for the resuscitation of Apoje Farm Settlement and Lomiro Oil Palm Plantation to create employment for people and generate more revenue for the State.

- 6.6 **COMMANDANT AREGBESOLA AKINOLA OF THE NATIONAL SCHOOL CRIME PREVENTION CORPS, OGUN STATE CHAPTER**, appreciated Mr. Governor's laudable achievements in the State, noting that the Corps is set up to curb bad behaviours and social vices such as fraternity among the primary and secondary school students. Consequently, he requested for an office building for leadership and rehabilitation of students in Abeokuta, two (2) motorcycles/official vehicle for staff mobilization during emergencies, financial assistance for payment of corps members and support of stakeholders to curb social unrest in the communities and schools (Primary, Secondary & Tertiary Institutions).
- 6.7 **DR. ADEKOYA, HOLGA, IJEBU ODE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA**, speaking on behalf of other HOLGAs in the division, expressed appreciation to the Governor for the bottom-up budget process and his achievements in education sector. He appealed for increased investment in education (secondary and tertiary institutions), agriculture to generate employment for youths, and skills acquisition programme to empower youths and improve their competitiveness anywhere in Nigeria.
- 6.8 **Muslims body represented by Imam Mikail Sile Rufai** thanked the Governor on behalf of the Muslim Community and the League of Imams & Alfas of Ijebu for always honouring Imams, referencing the occasion of installation of Awujale, the Paramount Ruler of Ijebu Land, Oba Dr. Sikiru Kayode Adetona CFR as King of the Muslim Kings in Yoruba Land. He further thanked the Governor for his quick intervention at ameliorating the disaster that befell the Rabitah Academy in Ilangba, appealing for the fixing of the carnal beside the Academy and reconstruction of road connecting the school. He also appreciated the unity of requests of the Royal Fathers which was centered on reconstruction of rural roads. Finally, he expressed reservation about the selection of Local Government

Chairmen appealing that Muslims should be used as Vice Chairmen in most of the Local Government Areas.

- 6.9 **Christians Association of Nigeria represented by Pastor Mathew Idowu** commended His Excellency for staying focused despite the much distractions. Consequently, he requested for the constitution of the Christian Pilgrims Welfare Board, sponsorship of Christian Pilgrims to Jerusalem and downward review of church building permit. Adding to the inputs on road construction, he drew attention to **Sabo-Itanrin-Osasa and the bridge linking Idode-Ehin Osun**. Finally, he called for the facelift of Bilikisu Sungbo Grove Tourist Centre noting that it would increase revenue generation.
- 6.10 **Mrs. Oluremi Badejo, President of the National Council of Women Societies**, expressed her gratitude to the Governor for his support in establishing the Women Affinity Group (WAG). She advocated for the implementation of a 35% women participation in governance, appealing that women should be selected as running mate for Chairman in the upcoming Local Government Election in the State. The women leader further canvassed for advocacy and awareness to promote special treatment for elderly people in public space, and government assistance on treatment of certain ailments such as High Blood Pressure, Diabetes and so on. Finally, she called for people friendly policies to gain their confidence and continued loyalty.
- 6.11 **Community Development Association, Ijebu Division** appreciated His Excellency for the impressive road construction projects in Ogun East, noting that most of the road projects requested for during the 2024 Town Hall Meeting are 80 percent completed. Thereafter, he invited attention to the spoilt state of the following roads: Sabo-Molode-Isiwo and Iyemule (spoilt by erosion) in Ijebu-Ode LGA, Iwalaye in Odogbolu LGA, Ijebu-Ife to Igbobi in Ijebu East LGA, Ogidi-Itamerin-Eruwon in Ogun Waterside, as well as the Farmer Sectorial Primary School in Ogun Waterside LGA. He also pleaded for the completion of Ikangba road, and urged His Excellency, the Senators and Members of the House of Representatives from the division to reopen necessary discussion on the creation

of Ijebu State at the national level. Finally, he thanked His Excellency for the donation of a brand-new bus for the Community Development Association.

- 6.12 **The Market Women** appreciated His Excellency for prioritizing the needs of the market women and assured him of their continued support. They urged the Governor to provide them with modern markets having solar light, toilet and boreholes facilities across the Local Government Areas in the division.
- 6.13 **People Living with Disabilities (PWDs)** requested that consideration should be given to them when designing government activities and programmes. As an example, school entrances should be designed in such a way that it would be accessible by their members. They added that government should use Sign language Interpreter to enhance their understanding during programmes involving their members. They also appealed for Cabinet appointment for their members, implementation of already passed PwDs Bill, inclusion of their members in the State Healthcare Insurance Scheme and lastly, donation of a bus for their use.
- 6.14 **Chambers of Commerce Ijebu Division** lauded His Excellency for the Ogun State Economic Transformation Project (OGSTEP) and the Ogun State Scheme Fund initiatives which have greatly assisted the young and budding entrepreneurs. They pleaded for the continuity of the projects for the next three years, and requested for soft loans to be disbursed through cooperative societies to douse the pressure of persistent rise in interest rate. Lastly, they pleaded for an ICT hub in Ijebu division to aid the technology drive of the division.
- 6.15 **Students Union represented by Comrade Olasehinde Oluwatobi** thanked His Excellency for his achievement in education sector and pleaded for increased investment in education and youth empowerment.
- 6.16 **Representative of Youth Council** appreciated His Excellency for his kind disposition to the youth constituency particularly for their representation on some committees. Thereafter, he pleaded for the establishment of the Ministry of Youths and the appointment of Commissioner for Youth to further harness the youths' potentials in the State. He also requested for the establishment of farm settlement

for youths to bring more youths into agriculture. Lastly, he pleaded for the inclusion of youths in the State Health Insurance Scheme.

6.17 **Represented by Comrade Omolara Sansa, Labour Union** appreciated His Excellency for the signing of N77,000 minimum wage for the Civil Servants effective October 2024. and asked him not to forget the retirees. She also thanked the Governor for the distribution of rice in Abeokuta and urged him to extend the gesture to other parts of the State. She further thanked Mr. Governor for the payment of all cooperative deductions, and for injecting N5.3billion into the pension and gratuity last month. Other requests are:

- payment of Leave Allowance for the remaining months in Year 2024
- Payment of outstanding Leave Allowance - Teachers (2015 – 2022) and Civil Servants (2016 – 2022)
- White Paper on the two Committees set up on Consequential Adjustment on Pensions and Contributory Pensions Scheme
- Training for labour leaders both local and foreign
- Awards for public and civil servants to spur better performance
- Holy pilgrimage for labour leaders

6.18 **Arewa Community** appreciated His Excellency and pleaded for the rehabilitation of SABO-ITANRIN road, stressing that the fixing of the road would greatly boost the socioeconomic activities and wellbeing of residents of the communities in the axis.

#### 6.19 **Online Inputs**

6.19.1 Government should begin price control system in the State to curb hike in prices of food items and other products/produce.

6.19.2 Government should sponsor sport activities from the primary school level to sharpen the learning skills of our students

6.19.3 Government should reintroduce Common Entrance Examination for all primary learners and parents to make students to improve students' seriousness and commitment to their studies.

6.19.4 Government should increase investment in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) which has been responsible good performance of our students in Jet competitions.

6.19.5 Government should extend construction of housing estate to Ijebu-Ode and Ijebu-Igbo

## **7.0 GOVERNOR'S RESPONSE THROUGH HIS REPRESENTATIVE**

7.1 The Governor ably represented by the Honourable Commissioner for Finance and Chief Economic Adviser thanked all the stakeholders, appreciating all accolades, criticisms, advises and attentions to various areas in need of immediate interventions.

7.2 Noting the large expanse of the State and several Federal roads within the State, he noted that His Excellency had already constructed over 600km of road across the State within the Five years of his Administration, adding that a new set of roads not less than ten, including rural roads of about 100Km, have been approved for immediate reconstruction in Ijebu division, and more would come in 2025 in view of the increased budget size.

7.3 On roads maintenance, the Commissioner noted that the Ogun State Public Works Agency established by His Excellency would take it up. On the farm settlements in the State, he responded that efforts are in top gear through Public Private Partnership to revitalize those legacy farm settlements. He allayed the fear that Christians Pilgrims Welfare Board had been abolished and that sponsoring of Christian faithful to holy pilgrimage would be considered. The Commissioner affirmed that the bill on creation of Ijebu State was progressing. Regarding the construction of modern markets, he assured that it would be looked into. Concerning housing estates in Ijebu-Ode and Ijebu-Igbo, the Commissioner said the Governor's initiative of slum regeneration would address it. He assured the special people that the Ministry of Physical Planning and Urban Development would see to their registered challenge through new building code for commercial developers while the issue of PWDs bill and health insurance would be considered. On the issue of Tourist Centres, Bilikisu Osungbo, he noted that it would be

considered. On consequential adjustment to contributory pensions and gratuities and minimum wage, he revealed that both were already receiving due attention, assuring that minimum wage would not be limited to engaged workers. Closing the response, the Commissioner appreciated all the participants, assuring that their meaningful inputs would be tabled before His Excellency and be considered in the 2025 Budget.

## **8.0 VOTE OF THANKS**

**8.1** The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Budget and Planning, Mrs. Olufunmilayo Ajimo Dada appreciated all Stakeholders for their attendance and meaningful contributions towards the preparation of 2025 - 2027 Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) and Year 2025 Budget and wished them safe journey to their various destinations.


